### DRESS CODE BYLAWS

The following questions have been raised by a Member Association concerning the new bylaw changes of Article 3.22. The answers are supplied by the C&R Committee.

**1. For which competitions do the new Dress Code Regulations apply?**

The C&R Committee is unanimous that Bylaw Book 1, 3.22.1.1 and 3.22.1.5 inclusive, passed in the December 2003 Council meeting, will be effective for the Athens Olympics only, and will be subject to further discussion and voting by Council for other Target Archery events.

For other tournaments they are guidelines, but not obligatory.

The rules apply to championships they are intended for, which are indoor and outdoor Target Archery (not Field, 3DI, Ski Archery, Flight).

The rules apply to athletes competing in adult classes, although, they are highly recommended for the Junior classes at our World Championships.

**2. What is a tracksuit bottom?**

A loosely fitting pant with an elastic waist (no belt) and elastic cuffs at the ankles worn by athletes for a workout or to warm up. (See Appendix I, Item 2.)

**3. What is to be understood by 'oversize', 'baggy' pants or shorts?**

By that is understood normal size clothing of ready-made design, clothing fitting the athlete in question neatly, is required. (See Appendix I, Item 1.)

Shorts do not cover the knees.

Pants cover the legs full length from the waist to the top of the foot.

**4. How is the reference to sport shoes, socks, belt and hat to be understood?**

The word "should" in that paragraph is interpreted as "must" by the C&R Committee so as to make sure that improper use of these clothing items do not destroy the archers' or team uniform appearance. Medical considerations concerning shoes or socks will be respected.

**5. What kind of footwear is a 'sandal'?**

A sandal is light footwear with an open or partly open and unprotected (toes) upper part. The sole is attached by means of straps, thongs or strings.

**6. How can problems of room on the back be solved with respect to 'name', 'country' and 'back number'?**

Recommendation of the President - The name and the country should be printed on the top of the back of the shirt, so as to leave room for the back number. Pin the back number right under the country name. If it overhangs the waistband, pin both sides of the back number on the shirt, just above the waistband, with the minimum overhang over the waistband.
